

Opioid Use Disorder + Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome



You Impacted NAS Structure Measures! Baseline compared to April - June 2021

Average percentage of nursing staff caring for newborns trained in validated assessments for NAS 67% vs. 85% (18%)

Used standardized nonpharmacologic protocols for NAS 70% (Oct.-Dec. 2019) vs. 89% (19%)

You Impacted OUD Structure Measures! Baseline compared to April - June 2021

Standardized education materials for OUD/NAS

42% vs. 87% (**1**45%)

Used a validated, self-report screening tool for substance use in pregnancy

39% vs. 84% (**1**45%)

Provide opioid pharmacotherapy for pregnant women with OUD

47% vs. 74% (**1**27%)


Developed referral relationships with OUD treatment programs

71% vs. 95% (**1**24%)

Developed clinical pathways/order sets for pregnant women with OUD
