

As an action arm of the PA Maternal Mortality Review Committee (MMRC), the PA PQC supports perinatal care teams in adopting key interventions to achieve collective aims.

After stakeholders across Pennsylvania stood up the PA PQC in April 2019, hospitals experienced a collective impact with funding from PA DDAP and the Henry L. Hillman Foundation: a 56% increase in the number of hospitals using validated substance use screens, a 52% increase in the number of hospitals using clinical order sets for maternal OUD, and a 37% increase in the number of hospitals using non-pharmacological protocols for NAS.

CMS' Hospital Inpatient Quality Reporting Programs' <u>Maternal Morbidity Structural Measure</u> is based on PQC participation. This measure is also connected to CMS' "Birthing-Friendly" designation.

2022 Focus Areas

Multi-disciplinary teams, with representatives from the inpatient/outpatient settings and community, can join PA PQC initiatives by registering at the hospital-level.

- Substance-Exposed Newborns
- Moving on Maternal Depression
- Immediate Postpartum LARC
- Severe Hypertension (affiliated with the ACOG Alliance for Innovation on Maternal Health, AIM)

How the PA PQC Supports Your Team

- Provides guidance on forming and structuring teams and quality improvement
